EXHIBITOR INFORMATION – SHOW STATEMENT:

Any and all entries in this horse show shall be conditioned upon the following terms and conditions: None of the UPHA Chapter 10 Saddlebred Horse Shows, UPHA Chapter 10, or its officers and directors, the owner of the facility, Equine Sports Council, the show manager, or any employee, independent contractor or volunteer of the show shall in any way, jointly or individually, be responsible for, or have any liability for, any loss, accident, damage or loss, including loss of life, that may occur to any person, including any exhibitor, owner, trainer, agent, groom, stable, animal, spectator, any property or equipment, sustained at, or as a result of, the UPHA Chapter 10 Saddlebred Horse Show held at the facility in Woodstock, IL. All horses must be kept under control and, if they are not, they may be barred from competition and entry fees forfeited at the discretion of the show management.

Show management reserves the right to change officials at any time and to refuse entries of any exhibitor not in good standing with IASPHA, ESC, IHPBEA, ASAW or MAHSA. The judge's decision is FINAL. All classes will be run under current UPHA Chapter 10 Academy Rules. If not covered by Chapter 10, current ESC rules will be followed.

ADMISSION OF HORSES

Horses will be admitted no earlier than 3:00 on Thursday.
Warm Up Ring and arena will be available for use Thursday.

PARKING

Trailers must be parked in approved trailer locations. Campers must be parked in approved camping locations only.

BEDDING

No first bedding will be provided per stall. Shavings will be available at \$11 per bag from the show office. NO STRAW BEDDING OR OUTSIDE BEDDING ALLOWED. All bedding must be purchased from Beyond Stable Farm.

STABLING

All stalls are 10' x 10' with tongue and groove solid wood on three sides. Please note the facility prohibits putting screws or nails into the wood. Staples are acceptable. The floor is concrete.

CAMPING

RV Parking spots are available for \$30 per night. This includes 30-amp electrical hookup. Please reserve on entry form.

WARM-UP RING SAFETY REGULATIONS

To ensure the safest possible event, only participants (riders/drivers, trainers and grooms) are permitted in the warm-up area, preferably, one class before they compete. Be courteous to novice or young riders, be mindful when changing directions, enter quietly, and avoid blocking the gates. Abuse of any kind will not be tolerated. If you see a rider, handler, trainer, or anyone else violating the welfare of a horse or rider, report it to management. We want to create a safe, positive, and fun atmosphere for all to enjoy, and continue to set a good example to all who are watching. Appropriate warm up ring etiquette will be enforced.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

All horses shipped into the State of Illinois must have the required health certificates issued by a veterinarian from the state or region. Negative Coggins test for Equine Infectious Anemia required for each horse within the prior 12 months. Horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. All horses on the show grounds must be in good health. Animals showing evidence of contagious or infectious diseases will be removed from the grounds at management or facility discretion.

ENTRIES

Entries close April 20 2024. All stall and office fees must be paid for and postmarked by April 20th to avoid the post entry fee. The show committee reserves the right to decline any entry and return the entrance fee. This committee may prohibit any one from attending or showing a horse. It also may remove any owner, stable employee, or horse from the ring or grounds without liability. Entries not containing all necessary documents to verify eligibility for horse/rider/owner/trainer/handler will be considered incomplete. Entry blanks do require three signatures and complete addresses for owners and trainers.

POST ENTRY FEES

There will be a post entry fee of \$25 per horse on entries postmarked after the show entry closing date.

REFUNDS

No refunds, except for a veterinarian's certificate of unfitness. Only class fees will be refunded. No refunds on stalls ordered.

HORSE SHOW OFFICE TAB

All exhibitors must leave a blank, signed check in the show office before receiving numbers. All checks returned by the bank and having to be resubmitted will be subject to a \$50 fee charged by UPHA Chapter 10.

DOGS

Dogs must be confined or on a leash. Owner assumes all liability for their dog. Due to safety and liability concerns, all pets in the stabling area must be leashed or contained at all times and crated or contained in a stall/tack room during the horse show performances. Animals may not block passage in aisleways at any time

TWO MINUTE GATE RULE

A two-minute gate rule will be enforced. Notify the horse show office in cases where a gate hold in excess of two minutes is required.

SPLITS AND CANCELLATIONS

Show management reserves the right to cancel, combine or split classes due to the number of entries per class. Recommended class size for under saddle classes in the indoor arena is 8-10 entries, and 6 entries for indoor driving classes. Management reserves the right to split any class when safety is a concern.

CHAMPIONSHIP ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible to compete in a divisional championship class, a horse or rider must be shown in one other class in that division.

EXHIBITORS AGE

The age of the exhibitor on December 1 will be considered the age for class entry.

ACADEMY

Academy classes are open to any rider presently enrolled in a professionally operated riding lesson program. Riders must be mounted on school horses. Horses in academy classes may be owned by anyone but they cannot be in training and they **MUST** currently earn their living in a lesson program. Riders may show their own horses in academy provided the horse is regularly used in a professional lesson program. Academy horses may be shown by non-academy riders in any other classes in the show for which they are eligible. The age of riders is as of December 1. All academy riders must be entered by the entry date deadline so splits may be determined if necessary.

If academy entries are being completed on Horse Shows Online, please enter each academy rider separately (on their own entry form). A horse may be entered multiple times, and this will ensure each academy rider will have their own back number.

ACADEMY ATTIRE

Jodhpurs or dark pants, a collared white or colored long sleeve shirt, tie, jodhpur boots or sturdy shoes. Sweater vest, sweater or fitted vest permitted; no habits or hats. *ASTM/SEI Helmets are strongly recommended and are required for 10 and under riders.*

ACADEMY EQUIPMENT

Horse must be shown in appropriate saddle (cutback or pleasure). Normal academy equipment (i.e., Martingales, snaffles, etc.) permitted in walk-trot and walk-trot-canter classes. Wraps, shin boots, bell boots and blinkers are permitted.

ADVANCED LEADLINE WALK AND TROT

Riders will be led in at a walk and worked each way of the ring. The riders will be individually trotted past the judge. Riders are expected to post, but correct diagonals are not required. Class will be judged.

ACADEMY HORSEMANSHIP

Will be judged 50 % on basic riding skills, and 50% on basic showmanship skills. Rider's ability to show the horse is paramount. Diagonals will not count. Class will not be asked to back.

NOVICE RIDER

Open to riders that have not won three classes in their respective division (Walk/Trot and Walk/Trot/Canter).

GREEN RIDER

Green Rider is defined as an academy rider in their first calendar year of showing (January-December).

Walk-trot riders may only enter walk-trot equitation and/or walk-trot pleasure classes. Walk-trot-canter riders may only enter walk-trot-canter equitation and/or walk-trot-canter horsemanship classes.

PATTERN CLASSES

Pattern classes are to be run where a rider/horse enters the ring one rider at a time and executes a specific pattern posted a minimum of one hour before the class. No rail work. Judged on the combination of the rider's skill of controlling the horse, accuracy of the pattern, and the rider's equitation. Horses may be shared. No backing will be asked for in the pattern. Recommended splitting at 12-15 entries.

EQUITATION CHAMPIONSHIPS

Exhibitors must have been entered, shown, and judged in their qualifying class to be eligible to enter their respective championship. Management reserves the right to split the championship based on entries. It is recommended that a minimum of four riders be asked to perform an individual workout in Academy Equitation Championships, and workouts must be chosen from the list below.

Walk and Trot Championships: Workouts 1 thru 3.

Walk/Trot/Canter Championships: Workouts 2 thru 8.

1. Stand up in posting position – hold position until judge says to sit. Hands may be on saddle.
2. The judge can ask some riders to go back to the rail and do a workout around the ring at a walk-trot, reverse walk-trot, etc. and return to lineup.
3. Trot a straightaway showing a change of diagonals; rider must start on correct diagonal.
4. Trot down straightaway to end, stop, reverse and canter back.
5. On a straightaway, trot half way on the correct diagonal, stop, and canter the remaining distance on the correct lead.
6. Trot a figure eight or trot a serpentine.
7. Canter down straightaway, stop, then ride a circle at a trot.
8. Trot down straightaway, stop, and canter a circle.

ACADEMY DRIVING

A Pleasure Driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the ability and skill of the driver to manage the horse or pony in the ring. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk and trot. Manners to be judged. Drivers are encouraged to have an instructor in the cart for safety.

SINGLE-BIT DIVISION

Single Bit classes are open to Amateur or Juvenile riders in a snaffle bit only (no curb bits or curb chains allowed), with a running martingale, German martingale or draw rein. All tack should be of show ring quality. Riders are to wear appropriate show ring attire. Horse/rider combinations may not cross enter into another division, with the exception of the Model, Showmanship and Pattern classes, unless otherwise stated in the prize list. The same horse/rider combination may not compete in both the W/T and the W/T/C sections of the Single Bit division at the same horse show.

SCHOOLHORSE HORSEMANSHIP/EQUITATION

The criteria for school horse academy classes are that the school horse is farm owned, barefoot or simply shod, older type horse or open breed horse with a lesser head carriage, and excessive motion or headset will be penalized.
